

A WORD FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

t is with great joy and very deep appreciation that I bring this note from my desk as Executive Director of FAECARE Foundation. This report covers two years of our activities as an organization.

The year 2019 was a very intentional year for us, as we continued in our already established programs and

focused on enhancing our performances in line with our mission. FAECARE Foundation along with three other women led NGOs formed a coalition to work on a project focusing on Inclusive budgeting for Sexual reproductive health rights and services. The project ran effectively from 2019 and also in 2020 with slight project focus change in 2020 to accommodate the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic.

Dear Friends and Partners,

The year 2020 began with a lot of anticipation and plans to expand on our programs. We hit the ground running as the year began but never anticipated the drastic turn of events as global focus shifted with the COVID-19 pandemic. To remain effective in adding value to the lives of our target vulnerable groups, we had to re-strategize, it was obvious that because of the COVID-19 pandemic, it was not business as usual. Even though our plans on expansion of program coverage was put on hold we were still able through strategic design and thinking to remain relevant in interventions related directly to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As unique as the year 2020 was, it did teach us a lot as an organization. We were able to reach over one hundred women with disabilities with much needed food palliatives during the peak of the lockdown period. We also provided special food palliative packs for vulnerable children. In moving with the times and maximizing the digital space, we increased our capacity and use of social media to raise awareness on several key issues. All these and more, were some of our achievements in 2019 & 2020

Here we are in 2021 and even though we are still experiencing the effects of covid-19 by beginning the year with a second wave, we are very optimistic that our plans will be fulfilled in the most creative ways, and that our goals we have set to achieve will be achieved in the most dynamic ways. The year 2021 is a very deliberate year for us as we intend to expand on our already established programs. We intend to extend our in-school youth development program, Project SMART to junior secondary schools, we also intend to have more FAECARE Kids Club centers among other well laid out plans.

e are proud of what we have accomplished together in our different program areas in FAECARE Foundation. We view our work as an honor to serve and cause change, we see every opportunity as an ultimate success story.

PURPLE 2019 (CHILDREN'S CHARITY CONCERT)

very year as part of our organizations programs and projects tailored for vulnerable children, we host a Children's Charity Concert tagged "PURPLE".

The 2019 Children's Charity Concert 'PURPLE' (7th edition) recorded over 2500 children in attendance with children from at least 13 homes participating in one activity and presentation. In this year's edition of PURPLE we encouraged public seeking through presentations by children. Some children were awarded as PURPLE star for their exceptional presentations, long standing partners were also awarded. The program provided basic support services like psychosocial support, over 2500 children received education materials.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic PURPLE 2020 did not hold

Kids Club



AECARE Kids Club is our monthly program aimed at bringing children in communities together to teach values through fun learning approach and interaction in areas such as Civic, Arts, Health, Life skills etc. In 2019 we carried out monthly activities in our four Kids Club Centers; Oginigba, Mgbesilaru, Mgbaraja and Rumukwurushi. We have an average of 30 children membership at our different centers. Support Services range from Education, health and health education, psychosocial support, nutrition and life skills building.



FAECARE Kid's holiday club

FAECARE Kid's holiday club was organized for children in Rmukwurushi communities for one week during the long vacation. A total of 202 (110 female & 92 male) participated. Lessons and topics focused on Moral lessons, Civic Education, Public speaking, Bead making, Table setting & Etiquette, First aid, Cooking lessons, drug prevention, treatment and Care, Drawing, games, competitions, and awards.

Project **SMART**



where we speak and engage inschool youths in making SMART goals and developing value systems that would guide them in right decision making as regarding their education and lifestyle choices. From 2019 to early 2020 just before the COVID-19 pandemic caused schools to shut down, we engaged and interacted with 1274 students (621 males & 653 females) from 14 secondary schools.



Vitamin A & Deworming Program

ur vitamin A and Deworming program is targeted at children to curb the challenge of micro-nutrient deficiency. A total of 3681 doses of Vitamin A and 3549 doses of Deworming tablets were administered to 4590 children through our community and school based outreaches in 15 communities and during the Rivers state wide Maternal, Child and Neonatal Health week. The COVID-19 lockdown affected our ability to reach children but we are grateful that we were still able to participate in the State wide MCNH week of 2020.

MULTIVITAMINS FOR PREGNANT AND LACTATING WOMEN

Multivitamin tablets were administered to pregnant and lactating women under the period of review. Through our community and health facility based outreaches we were able to provide this service to 135 women in over 10 communities. COVID-19 did affect our partners from getting commodities across to us all in all we were still able to serve with commodities available.





DRF Coalition Project

In the year 2019, FAECARE Foundation formed a coalition with Inclusive Friends Association, Abuja, and Advocacy for Women Living with Disabilities Initiative (AWWDI), and Haly Hope Foundation. This coalition made of four women led NGOs led by IFA implemented a project with support from Disability rights fund (DRF).

The goal of this two year project was to advocate for the increase in the budget allocations for sexual and reproductive health services in order to implement the Sexual Reproductive Health Policy, raise awareness on Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) of Women and Girls with disability, to combat stigma, and increase the number of Women and Girls With Disability advocating for their rights.

In the first year of the project which ended in year from 2019 to 2020, a lot was achieved. In year 2020 however, the focus of the project had to be shifted to awareness raising and sensitization on the COVID-19 pandemic and how it was a ffecting the sexual reproductive health rights and services on women and girls

with disabilities.

In year 1 of the coalition project the coalition had many outcomes:

- Multiple Press Conferences on implementation of Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights for Persons with Disability in Nigeria in Port Harcourt, Bauchi and Abuja.
- · Technical trainings for coalition members on budget monitoring and advocacy strategies.
- Training for over 50 women with disabilities on Prioritizing Inclusive Budget for Sexual and Reproductive Health of Persons with Disability in Nigeria in Abuja and Bauchi
- Nationwide Campaign on Covid-19 and Gender Based Violence focusing on Women and Girls with Disabilities via traditional, mainstream and social media.
- · Virtual Conference on the impact of covid-19 on women and girls with disability as regards their sexual reproductive health rights.
- Virtual Training OnSexual Reproductive HealthRights Of Women And GirlsWith Disability and

Prioritizing Inclusive Budgeting for Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights of Persons with Disability in Nigeria for Women and Girls with Disability.

- Virtual Training on the Role of Stakeholders in Providing Gender Based Violence Victims Support and Social Protection of Women and Girls with Disabilities

The overall impact of the first year of the project is evident in the reach and spread of the project number of women and girls with disabilities whose capacity was built, the stakeholders engaged and the general public sensitized on key issues of SRHR.

FAECARE Education Support



his is one of the organization programs aim to support orphans and vulnerable children who are out of school by enrolling them back school. A total of 18 children from are enrolled in our education support program. In the early part of year 2020, before the lockdown it was reported that some caregivers to four of the children opted to move their wards to the state primary school due to the introduced school feeding program. In year 2020, COVID-19 affected school children in an adverse way especially for children in rural communities who had no access to virtual learning. We anticipate that as schools resume and normalcy is restored.







Staff Trainings



In line with the organization's goal of ensuring that the capacity of its staff is being built, the staff of the organization participated in several capacity building trainings in 2019 & 2020; A influencer training on sensitization on drugs and drugs prevention, treatment and care (DPTC) organized by MTN in collaboration with United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, European Union and Federal Government of Nigeria. A Leadership training on basic leadership skills organized by FAECARE Foundation. A

OVC Vocational Skills Acquisition Pilot Program





VC Vocational k i 1 1 s Acquisition Pilot ProgramOrphans and Vulnerable children program is part of FAECARE Program that is tailored towards engaging and empowering young people who have completed Secondary School and are in the transition and waiting period, we believe that rather than while away time engaging them productively will be a lifelong advantage. For many vulnerable youths it will become a source of income whether they are able to further their education or while they are in their places of higher education. We did a pilot of the program

where a young lady was enrolled to learn a vocational skill.

In the month of August, 2019, we registered Loritaa graduate of our FAECARE Kids Club: Oginigba Center. Lorita finished her Senior Secondary School Examination (SSCE) and was in the period where she was waiting on what next to do. We negotiated and engaged De-Flawless BeautyPalourto train Lorita onHair Dressing and Makeupskills.

From month of September 2019 to August 2020 we monitored her progress through visits and counselling. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, Lorita remained engaged in her skills training.

On 20th August 2020

Lorita graduated from De-Flawless BeautyPalour as a make-up artist and a hair stylist, she was awarded a certificate of completion and excellence by De-Flawless BeautyPalour, and to support her newly acquired skills and future exploits FAECARE Foundation gave her a Make-up Box filled with required tools, and a congratulatory letter. LoritaOkoro has remained committed to using her skills and has done very well for herself. She intends to further her education and fills more confident that the necessary funds can now be raised to support her single mum's efforts.

FAECARE COVID-19 RELIEF AND PREVENTION CAMPAIGN

AECARE Foundation in her strategy on COVID-19 Relief and Prevention Campaign focused on Persons with Disabilities especially women with Disabilities and children. For Women with Disabilities the strategy had with three focal points- access to information, prevention and food Palliatives and for children it had two focal points prevention and food palliatives.



FAECARE COVID-19 Relief and Prevention Campaign for Women with Disabilities

Accessibility (Information)



mproving information on COVID-19 and Disability to the general public through mainstream and social media discussions and messaging. Our digital imprint had many impressions in the thousands.

In bid to improve access to information that PWDs had on COVID-19 we participated in several radio Interviews and radio discussions, on COVID-19 and Disability.

FAECARE Foundation developed, produced and disseminated COVID-19 Disability Guidelines and shared to 120 households with persons with Disabilities in Rivers and Akwaibom State.

Prevention

OVID Prevention Packs were provided for Women with Disabilities containing prevention products (hand sanitizer, hand wash, surface disinfectant and bleach) and hygiene products (sanitary pad, medicated, soap, bath disinfectant). A total of 40 Women with Disabilities received this specially packaged preventive packs.

We produced and circulated short video clips and easy to understand messages on different preventive measures against COVID-19 on social media.

Massive distribution of digital prevention information went far as other African countries and was used with permission by other organizations. Our handwashing demonstration videowas formally adopted and used by the Rivers State Public Health Emergency Operations Center (PHEOC) in their COVID-19 protocol and prevention campaign.

Food Palliatives

Providing Food Palliatives was a core part of our COVID-19 Relief and Prevention Campaign. During the lockdown we provided food palliatives for Women with Disabilities, the packs contained Rice, Beans, Garri, Milk, Oil, Tomato, Salt and Indomie. A total of 100 women with Disabilities in Rivers and Akwaibom State received food palliatives.



FAECARE COVID-19 Relief and Prevention Campaign for Children Prevention

s part of the efforts in the global pandemic specifically among Vulnerable Children, we developed, produced and disseminated child friendly easy to understand illustration guidelines for children. We also carried out demonstration exercises on hand washing for children in communities. Over 50 children benefitted from this exercise.

We produced and circulated short children's video on Covid-19 Preventive measures, the videos showed children demonstrating proper hand washing techniques, proper nose and mouth covering when sneezing



and other preventive measures.

Hygiene products (sanitary pad, medicated, soap, bath disinfectant) were specially packed for teenage girls. A total of 16 teens received this specially packaged hygiene care packs during the height of the lockdown.

Food Palliatives

Providing Food Palliatives was a core part of our COVID-19 Relief and Prevention Campaign. During the lockdown we also provided food palliatives for vulnerable children. The special children food palliative packs contained Rice, Powdered Milk, Biscuits, Vegetable Oil, Eggs, Custard, and Indomie. A total of 30children in four communities in Rivers State received these special children food palliative packs.



Orphanage Visitation

s part of marking the birthday of the director of FAECARE Foundation in 2020, the foundation visited three orphanage Homes (Priesthood, Jesus Orphanage and Saviors Charity Home) with the following items; Cartons of Indomie, Toiletries, Sanitary Pad, Exercise Books and Text Books, Hand Sanitizers, and Pencils. In 2019 we ensured to visit many orphanages with needed supplies, especially those who attended PURPLE 2019. Throughout the years from inception, we have remained a linkage and referral for partners and well-meaning individuals and corporations that want to do orphanage visitations, and have helped many plan elaborate programs and parties at some of these homes.







Self-Care Initiative Project

elf-Care Initiative is a Project that is focused on the health and wellness for Person with Disabilities. A total of 92 persons with disabilities (47 Male & 45 Female)in three communities were reached. By putting together prevention packages and prevention guideline illustration known as self-care kits and distributing to beneficiaries after careful demonstration, the goal of enhancing self-care to promote COVID-19 prevention for Persons with Disabilities was reached.

- · At least 90 persons with disabilities were taught to properly wash their hands through a practical demonstration
- · At least 90 persons with disabilities were taught how to disinfect their assistive device and surfaces
- At least 90 persons with disabilities received an illustrative guide of self-care prevention tips
- 20 women with disabilities were trained on how to make liquid soap thereby adding value to their lives, teaching them a skill and adding a possible source of income to improve livelihood.



UNITED NATIONS INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES



International Day of Persons with Disabilities (UNIPWD) has been celebrated annually on 3rd December around the world. FAECARE Foundation in Partnership with Nigeria Medical Association, Rivers state, marked the day with a free medical outreach for Persons with Disabilities.

In 2019 a total of 153 persons with disabilities (126 Male&27 Female) from five Local Govt. Areas

participated. In 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic the numbers was dropped in order to ensure COVID-19 protocols were observed, the free medical exercise focused on PWD community leaders. Services provided were free medical consultation, laboratory test, drugs, eye care and dental care. Our Executive Director also participated in several radio discussions and did presentations in virtual conferences and meetings to mark the UNIDPWD.

Reach-Out Community Program

Reach Out community programs are focused on bringing free basic medical and welfare support services to communities within communities. In 2019 and early 2020, we focused on collaborative efforts with faith based organizations, community based organizations and clinics to carry out this program, and unfortunately from April 2020 we were unable to do any outreaches due to measures like lockdown and social distancing.

The target populations at these programs and outreaches were women, youths and children (entire communities), in 2019& 2020 we served in six communities. Services provided were Free Medical Consultations, Vitamin A Supplementation, Deworming, Multivitamin, Malaria testing, welfare (clothing). A total of 811 persons (390male and 421 female) received direct medical services and over a thousand benefitted from welfare.















IMDACT Stories

beneficiaries of our empowerment program for women with disabilities; Hope Again Initiative. As part of monitoring and evaluating the program to see the impact. FAECARE carried at an assessment tagged Hope Again Initiative Alumna assessment, for all who had passed through the program (cycle 1, 2 and 3). A seed fund of was given to top alumna from the first cycle who showed innovation and resilience in entrepreneurship on assessment with respect to the vocational skills they learnt. A total of 7 alumnae received the seed fund.



ma-ObongEtimis a young woman who comes from and resides in Obot-Akara Local Govt. in AkwaIbom State. Her legs are affected by an impairment. Her vocational skill set was hair dressing. She has remained consistent in using her skill and has continued to make hair from her family compound, growing her customer base. When our team visited we were really impressed by her creativity and how she did not allow not having her space deter her. She was a recipient of the seed fund. On receiving the money, ImaObong went on to raise a structure, a simple building in the space she was given by the family based on her continued commitment. She is also doing very well and now owns her a shop where she is doing hair dressing.



lessing **ImansiSatu** rdayis a young lady who comes from and resides in NtoEdino in Obot-Akara Local Govt. in AkwaIbom State. As a child her left leg was affected by polio. Her vocational skill set is Tailoring and Fashion Designing. Since graduation, she opened her

tailoring shop in ObotAkara. She is doing really well in her tailoring business. She has had many cycles of apprentices, at the time our team visited she had four apprentice. With proceeds from her business she has added a weaving machine and big generator for the expansion of her business. Blessing ImansiSaturday is a true evidence of the impact of our program Hope Again Initiative. She is no longer the scared and shy dependent young lady we met at



ObotAkara four years ago, she is now a business owner, an employer and an independent young lady.

yaknno Monday Udoh is a young deaf lady that was not deterred when we were really concerned about her ability to participate and complete her Hope Again Initiative program, she remained committed and finished strong, her skills set was hairdressing. When our team visited we saw her making hair, what made us even more excited was that she had just opened her own shop. She was really excited and grateful that we did not give up on her during the training process two years ago, especially when communication was difficult. Nyaknno is an example of resilience personified and an impact story that shows how an opportunity given, taken and used properly can be life changing.

harity Dickson is from Ogbema community in Abua/Odual Local Govt. Area in Rivers State. She uses crutches to move around due to disability as a result of polio which affects both legs. Her vocational skill was Tailoring and Fashion Designing. She has since graduation stayed consistent, after a full year with her trainer, she went on to open her own business. Charity is really well, not only is she a tailor and fashion designer, she is also an employer and a trainer. She expanded her shop to also sell fabrics. When our team met up with Charity we were so encouraged. She is currently a second year university student at the Ignatius University being able to support herself to further her education, and a business owner, none of which would have been possible but for her participation in Hope Again Initiative four years ago. We are so grateful to have been able to create the opportunity with the help of our partners. When we asked her how she manages with her business she said she shuttles to ensure things are in order with her employees and the business. This is very commendable and we are really proud of Charity.

umoAberemiekaa young woman in Ogugbolowas very excited and happy when she received the COVID-19 relief palliatives and preventive packs from FAECARE Foundation. Excitement was all over her face when we delivered the preventive packs and palliatives to her, she said it was a much needed relief at that time of lockdown.



e l e n Kemgbarashar ed with us her sense of relief and was full of l a u g h t e r w h e n theFAECARE COVID-19 relief palliatives and preventive packs were given to her at Eleme. Subsequently she also participated in the liquid soap making training and testified that it would be much needed addition to her source of livelihood.

When we presented the FAECARE COVID-19 relief palliatives to them, mama was very happy and thankful because the support came at the critical period when they needed it. In all the excitement, her son jumped on top of her out of gladness and start kissing the mother upon seeing the palliatives and preventive packs. Even though MrsIbidulo is deaf, the joy and excitement in the household was palpable and next meals for her children were now a certainty.

disabilities with vocational skills and income generating materials.
