Dear friends and Partners,

A WORD FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is with a deep sense of service and joy that I bring this note from my desk as Founding Executive Director of Freky Andrew-Essien Care Foundation well known as FAECARE Foundation. After year 2020 and an introduction to the new normal, the year 2021 was a year of recovery of many from the global pandemic. It was important for us that we be very strategic in our approaches to programs and projects in line with our vision and mission as an organization.

The year 2021 began for us with a lot of deep concerns, many NGOs have long closed because of the lack of funding and dwindled funding streams. In spite of the financial constraints that are foreign to no one, we are very grateful to our partners who were steadfast in their support in cash and kind.

Looking back we find that we were able to do so much.

We held our annual children's charity concert "PURPLE" after the pause the previous year due to restrictions from COVID-19 protocols. It was amazing, simply put it was 'Wow'. Over 2500 children were in attendance, it was indeed a day of fun learning at its best and no child was left out. Our core OVC programs went on very strong. Our FAECARE Education Support program, which is a scholarship program for orphans and vulnerable children had great successes. Two children we enrolled who started in nursery/primary schools graduated from primary school. We had 10 new enrollees into the program as a result of a key partnership with Project Cornelius. With the funds the scholarship fund was for the first time extended to a child with disability.

Our in-school youth outreach program "Program SMART" greatly expanded in 2021 because of key partnership with Port Harcourt Crystal Lions Club during their youth empowerment program. Our PWD programs stayed on course as we were able to support over 40 women with disabilities doing business with cash and material support to improve their business prospects considering the effect COVID-19 had on many of these businesses. This was only possible because of a very generous donor and a fantastic partnership. In partnership with two organizations we were able to carry out an awareness campaigns to schools on Disability Based Violence in Port Harcourt. In moving with the times and maximizing the digital space, we increased our capacity and use of social media to raise awareness on several key issues. All these and more, were some of our achievements in 2021.

Here we are in 2022 and even though we are still experiencing the effects of covid-19 especially the economy we are confident that this will be another amazing year of great impact. We are very optimistic that our plans will be fulfilled in the most creative ways, and that the goals we have set to achieve will be achieved in the most dynamic ways.

On behalf of all of the Board of Trustees of FAECARE Foundation, we thank you for being a part of reaching out and touching lives. We are very grateful to those who have continued to partner with us, your confidence in our vision and mission is inspiring and encouraging. We are proud of what we have accomplished together in our different program areas in FAECARE Foundation in 2021. We view our work as an honor to serve, promote and effect change. We see every opportunity as an ultimate success story.

PURPLE 2021 (CHILDREN'S CHARITY CONCERT)

Every year as part of our organizations programs and projects tailored for vulnerable children, we host a Children's Charity Concert tagged "PURPLE". The goal of this exciting program and fun event organized for ALL children irrespective of status is to Integrate children from different backgrounds and status: orphans and vulnerable children, less privileged, children with disabilities and other children.

In 2021, we held the 8th edition after not holding it in 2020 due to COVID-19 restriction protocols, it was like a breath of fresh air. Over 2500



children (not counting teens and adults), were in attendance. The program was loaded from start to finish with purple carpet, inclusive games, music, dance, recitations, lessons, gifts and Purple party packs for children. A high point was public speaking by a young boy, Wisdom Osiri. It was a really exciting event loaded with different forms of support: Psychosocial support, Education supplies etc for the children.

FAECARE Education Support

FAECARE Education support program is a partial scholarship program offered to vulnerable children that should be in school but are unable to due to lack of finances, increased vulnerability and child status. Our intervention on assessment is to engage a school within the community where the child is resident and take on school fees in partnership with the caregiver, as well as school supplies like, school bags, flasks, shoes, stationery, exercise books and text books, depending on the needs.

We have experienced a lot of success in this program, with children in the program graduating to secondary school, even with the effect of COVID-19. The main effect was relocation of many children by caregivers to other relations in other cities. We encouraged the caregivers to ensure that parts of the condition of the move to distant relations should be that these children remain to school. Currently, seventeen children from four communities including a child with disability are enrolled in our education support program. This was especially made possible in this new school year, 2021/22 session, by a strategic partnership with Project Cornelius, United Kingdom.



FAECARE Kids club

FAECARE Kids Club is our monthly program aimed at bringing children in communities together to teach values through fun learning approach and interaction in areas such as Civic, Arts, Health, Life skills etc. In 2021 we added a new center to our existing kid's club centers. Our four Kids Club Centers Oginigba, Mgbesilaru, Mgbaraja, Rumukwurushi and Rumunduru. We have a total of 70 children membership at our different centers. Support Services range from Education, health and health education, psychosocial support, nutrition and life skills building.



Project SMART

Project Smart is our in-school youth outreach program where we go to secondary schools to speak with and interact with youths on value adding topics and subjects, the purpose is to speak and engage in-school youths, provide information and learning's in making smart goals and developing a value system that would guide them in right decision making as regarding their education and lifestyle choices.



Project SMART

In 2021, we had the privilege to interact with junior and senior secondary students (in-school youths) in 30 (thirty) schools. We engaged and interacted with over 3000 students. We focused our conversation at different times on Self-Esteem, Goal Setting, Developing SMART Goals, Relationship between Boys and Girls, Responsibility and Disability Based Violence.

Our wider reach this year was made possible by two keen partnerships, one with Port Harcourt Crystal Lions Club during their week long youth empowerment program. The second partnership was with and Teenagers Equip Network and Basileia vulnerable Persons Rights Initiative (BVPRI) where over five hundred students in ten secondary schools in Rivers state were sensitized on Disability and Disability Based Violence.

OVC/Teens Vocational Skills Training Program

OVC Vocational Skills Training Program now referred to as Teens Vocational Skills Training Program Pilot Program Orphans and Vulnerable children program is a FAECARE Program that is tailored towards engaging and empowering young people who have completed Secondary School and are in the transition and waiting period before tertiary education or their next phase of life.

After the pilot program where a young lady (teen) graduated from learning hairdressing and makeup skills a vocational skills. We enrolled two teens (male and female), to learn digital skills from October to December of 2021. During the training they acquired skills in Microsoft applications.





Reach Out One Touch (Vitamin A, Deworming & Multivitamins)

Our vitamin A and Deworming program is targeted at children in communities, to curb the challenge of micro-nutrient deficiency. A total of 3364 doses of Vitamin A and 3793 doses of Deworming tablets were administered to 4500 children through our community and school based outreaches in 15 communities and during the Rivers state wide Maternal, Child and Neonatal Health week. The COVID-19 lockdown affected our ability to reach children but we are grateful that we were still able to participate in the State wide MCNH week of 2021.

A total of 109,440 doses of Multivitamin tablets were administered to pregnant and lactating women under the period of review. Through our community and health facility based outreaches we were able to provide this service to 608 women in over 10 communities. We are really grateful to our in-kind partners Vitamin Angels for ensuring that these commodities are available.

Hope Again Initiative ...

women with disabilities empowerment program

This year we carried out a variation of this program; women with disabilities business empowerment support.

In 2016 and 2018 FAECARE Foundation empowered women with disabilities across the South-South Region of Nigeria to learn vocational skills and then were provided materials to continue in these skills. Many of these women went on to use the skills and items received to kick off business, further their education, become employers of labor among other prospects.

It is from our continuous interaction with these women via the HAI Alumni assessment program and post COVID-19 activities, that it was brought to our notice, the reality of the struggle, for many small businesses to bounce back. It therefore became imperative for us in FAECARE Foundation to focus efforts in providing some form of support to these women and other women with





disabilities with cash and materials for their businesses to enable them continue or find their way back to the financial independence many had begun to enjoy.

In the month of July 2021 we entered an amazing partnership with a donor, sponsor, partner and friend of FAECARE Foundation. In the month of August, to kick off and ensure due diligence of the items and cash support received, we carried out a needs assessment on women with disabilities with disabilities to determine who received materials or cash support for a boost to their business. A total of 25 (Twenty Five) women with disabilities were supported with cash and materials for their businesses in Rivers and Akwa Ibom State of the South-South Region of Nigeria. We were able to support a lot more women than the twenty initial target with extra support.

The impact of this project is immediate as all businesses supported have been boosted and remained open. These women with disabilities who were beneficiaries remain deeply grateful for the boost that has allowed them maintain financial freedom.



STAFF AND VOLUNTEER TRAININGS

With the view of building the capacity of her staff and volunteers, the organization began capacity building workshops once every two months throughout the year for staff and volunteers. In a series of these workshops the following topics were covered: Teaching and Communicating learning to children, Social Media Marketing and Strategy, the use and filling of Orphan and Vulnerable children enrolment form, Child status Index form and FAECARE Education Support enrolment form and Project Reporting and Communication.

Still on capacity building of staff and volunteers, the organization sponsored seven (7) persons for Global Leadership Summit held here in Port Harcourt Rivers State. Staff also participated in Non-profit Management Courses organized by Nigerian Network of NGO (NNGO) in Port Harcourt and Abuja.

The staff and Volunteers of Basileia vulnerable Persons Rights Initiative (BVPRI), FAECARE Foundation, and Teenagers Equip Network (Club TEN) were trained as facilitators on Disability Based violence for secondary school students. The training was facilitated by the Executive Director of FAECARE Foundation.

The testimonials were very positive on the impact of these workshops and trainings.



United Nations International Day for Persons with Disabilities

Since 1992, the United Nations International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPWD) has been celebrated annually on 3rd December around the world. This day aims to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights and wellbeing of persons with Disabilities in every aspect of political, social, economic and cultural life.

The Theme for this year's International Day is "Leadership and Participation of persons with disabilities toward an inclusive, accessible and sustainable Post-COVID19 World."

As part of celebrating United Nations International Day for persons with Disability, the foundation carried out media advocacy based on this year's theme at the following radio stations in Rivers state; Classic FM 91.1, Garden city 89.9, Treasure FM 91.5, and Wave FM 91.7.

Hope Again Initiative Plus ...empowering Persons with Disabilities

In the course of empowerment focused on only women with disabilities, it became evident that we could through this initiative also reach out to some men with disabilities, hence the program Hope Again Initiative Plus.

Towards the end of 2021, we embarked on a project with support from World Connect. This version of Hope Again Initiative Plus which will be completed in 2022 is a community-based training and farming program that will improve the economic status and well-being of persons with disabilities through cucumber farming. It is an income-generating program for persons with disabilities within the community that will economically strengthen them and improve their livelihoods.

Twenty persons with disability at Obot-Akara were screened and selected for the cucumber farming project.

IMPACT

Stories

Assistive Devices are a part of life of many Persons with Disabilities. They are external devices that are designed, made, or adapted to assist a person to perform a particular task. Many people with disabilities depend on these devices to enable them to carry out daily activities and participate actively and productively in community life. Yet as important as it is, still so many are without.

Supporting PWDs with these devices to improve mobility and activities of daily living is made possible by support from an amazing donor and partner. A total of six (6) Persons with Disabilities received assistive devices; four (4) wheelchairs and two (2) crutches in Rivers and Abia State. .

Akpelu John Chinonso is a twenty seven (27) year old final year student in the Rivers State University who is a wheelchair user from polio. When

we met him, he had a lot of difficulty attending lectures or moving around because of a very bad wheelchair. The lack of mobility was beginning to affect his class attendance. Through the kind and generous donation of our partners, we were able to provide this much needed support to John. Not only did he get back his mobility, through this gesture we were able to indirectly support his quest for higher education and his ability to attend his lectures with ease.



Martha Njoku is a petty trader based in Eleme in Rivers State, We met Martha and noticed that she moved around

by placing her right hand on her right thigh and bent to move. This left her with blisters on her thighs where she placed her hands to move and made her prone to falls and accident. The strained and limited mobility she experienced had affected her

business as she was unable to easily go to the market to purchase items. Through the kind and generous donation of our partner we were able to provide her with crutches, the impact was immediate. For the first time in a long time, Martha no longer needed to bend and move, with the support of the crutches she could lean on it and walk up right. She was also grateful for the relief from her thighs and was very keen on expressing how she could now easily go to market without fear of falling

FAECARE Education Support(FES) program is a partial scholarship offered to children enrolled in our OVC program to begin and complete nursery and primary school education. Children that should be in school but are unable to due to lack of finances, increased vulnerability and child status. As part of partial scholarships provided the direct beneficiaries of the education support program receive education supplies every term: school bags, flasks/water bottles, shoes, stationery, exercise books and text books as we get funding.



Cecilia Obuowher hails from Omuorlu village in Omudioga community located in Emuoha in Rivers state. Through our OVC and FAECARE

Education Support program in Omudioga community in 2014for orphans and vulnerable children in the community, we met and enrolled Cecilia into the program. At the time of enrolment, Cecilia had never been in school. In September, 2015, seven (7) years old Cecilia was registered At Living God Nursery and primary school, Omudioga to start school through the scholarship scheme of FAECARE Foundation beginning in nursery school. In 2021, she finished her basic education at Living God nursery and Primary school through the support of FAECARE Foundation. She has written Common Entrance and started junior secondary school this 2021/2022 academic session.

Oluchi Amadi comes from Omudioga community in Emuoha, Rivers state. At the time of her enrolment into the program, Oluchi was not in school. She dropped from school due to lack of funds to train her in school by the caregiver. In September, 2015, Oluchi was registered at Living God Nursery and primary school, Omudioga to start and complete her primary education. In 2021, Oluchi Amadi finished her basic education and graduated from Living God nursery and Primary school through the support of FAECARE Foundation.

FAECARE Foundation: What was your first interaction with the organization?

Kelechi: My first interaction with FAECARE Foundation was in 2014 when I volunteered at the free medical outreach organized by the foundation at Oginigba Comprehensive Secondary School as a health worker.

FAECARE Foundation: When and why did you join the organization?

Kelechi: During my NYSC at Dutse, Jigawa state, i carried out a community service development project which earned me an award of Excellence. After service, I decided to pursue community service as a career due to my love and passion for it. I relocated to Port Harcourt after youth service in search of greener pastures. It was during this period that identified with FAECARE Foundation as a volunteer. This is because as a foundation they are into community service development which is in line with my career. It was in the first quarter of 2015 that I reached out to the organization expressing my interest to work with the foundation as a staff.
